 - Focus on younger people to join through promoting the benefits of CPD and the routes to CEng & IEng




Plans for 2016

- Offer CPD support for SaRS members eg through a contacts list or maybe drop ins before events?





 What type of London Branch events would you like to attend?





 - Support in structured CPD and learning activities




 What would be the best timings for and evening event for you?
